

Appalachian Children Coalition Grant Policy on Indirect Costs

Purpose:

This policy establishes guidelines for the reimbursement of indirect costs on grants or contracts awarded by the Appalachian Children Coalition.

Scope:

This policy applies to all grants and contracts issued by the Appalachian Children Coalition, including those to external organizations.

Definition of Indirect Costs:

Indirect costs are expenses incurred by a grant recipient that cannot be directly attributed to a specific project or activity. These may include but are not limited to administrative expenses such as office space, utilities, general office supplies, and other organizational overhead.

Policy Statement:

1. Indirect Cost Rate Limit:

- o Indirect costs charged to any grant or contract awarded by the Appalachian Children Coalition may not exceed 10% of the total direct costs.
- A 0% indirect cost rate applies to grants or contracts awarded to government agencies, private foundations, and for-profit organizations.
- 2. Calculation of Indirect Costs: Indirect costs must be calculated as a percentage of the total allowable direct costs of the grant/contract. Direct costs include expenses directly attributable to the project, such as personnel, equipment, and program-related activities.
- 3. **Documentation Requirements:** Grant/contract recipients may be required to provide a detailed budget clearly delineating direct costs associated with the grant/contract.
- 4. **Effective Date:** This policy is effective as of July 1, 2023 and will apply to all grants and contracts awarded after that date.
